Those with experience on using IT to assist Chinese Language teaching and learning and/or instructing reading strategies in Chinese Language will have an advantage.

The appointee will be responsible for i) giving comments on Chinese passages written by the team; ii) verifying if the content is relevant to the Chinese Language Curriculum in Hong Kong; iii) giving comments on the technical platform for Chinese reading; (iv) visiting schools for meetings and class observations whenever necessary; (v) giving speech in our events/seminars to schools in Hong Kong, and (vi) undertaking any other duties as assigned.
